 And I Give to my friend Mr William Milbourn of
 my Lord Aulick's Office a Ring of the Value of Five
 Guinea And as to all the rest residue and remainder
 of my Estate of what kind or sort soever I Give and
 bequeath the same to my Brother William Almack of
 Pallmall and the above named Mr William Milbourn
 In Trust in the first place to pay thereout all my Just
 Debts and funeral Expenses and after Payment thereof
 In Trust to lay out and Invest the Residue in a
 Government or other good Securities and to pay the
 Interest and produce thereof to my Wife Rebecca for
 and during the Term of her Natural life and after her
 Death In Trust to pay the Interest and produce of
 One hundred pounds to my Sister Ann Cobb Wife of
 James Cobb of Sand Sutton in Yorkshire for her own
 Sole and Separate Use and Independent of her husband
 for and during her Natural life And also In Trust from
 and after the Death of my said Wife to pay the Interest
 and produce of Sixty pounds to my Sister Elizabeth Stott
 Wife of _____ Stott of Thottrop in Yorkshire for her
 own Sole and Separate Use and Independent of her
 husband for and during her Natural life And from and
 immediately after the Death of my said Wife I Give
 and bequeath to my Brother Thomas Almack One r.

hundred and fifty pounds and to my sister Anne Cobb thirty
 pounds. And after the respective Deaths of my said Wife
 and my sister Anne Cobb I give and bequeath to such
 Children of the said Anne Cobb as shall be living at her
 Death one hundred pounds to be equally Divided between
 them share and share alike. And after the respective
 Deaths of my said Wife and my sister Elizabeth Stott I give
 and bequeath to such Children of the said Elizabeth Stott by
 her first husband as shall be living at her Death fifty
 pounds to be equally Divided between them share and share
 alike. And after payment of the above Legacies I give and
 bequeath all the Rest and Residue of my Estate to be equally
 Divided amongst the three Children of my Brother William
 Almart (that is to say) William Elizabeth and Euphemia
 my Nephew and Nieces. And I hereby Nominate and
 Appoint my said Brother William Almart and the said
 W. William Willbourn Executors of this my Will hereby
 revoking all former Wills by me made and Declaring this to
 be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have
 written to set my hand and Seal this Twentieth third day of
 February in the Year of our Lord One thousand seven hundred
 and Sixty two, John Almart. Signed Sealed Published
 and Declared by the said John Almart as his last Will and

This Will was proved at London the Twentieth
 Day of April in the Year of our Lord One thousand Seven
 hundred and Sixty two before the Worshipful George
 Harris Doctor of Laws Surrogate of the Right Worshipful
 Sir Edward Simpson Knight also Doctor of Laws Master
 Keeper or Commissary of the Prerogative Court of
 Canterbury lawfully constituted by the Oath of William
 Almart the Brother of the deceased and William Willbourn
 the Executors named in the said Will to whom Administration
 was granted of all and singular the Goods Chattels and Credits
 of the said deceased they having been first sworn duly to Administer.
