William Chapman of Lincoln Inn in the County of Middlesex Gentleman maketh Oath & saith that by Articles of Agreement bearing date the eighth day of March Instant and made between William Willis of Saint James's Street in the County of Middlesex Esquire of the first part Duke Willis son of the said William Willis of the second part and John Allan Powell of Lincoln Inn in the County of Middlesex Gentleman one of the Attornies of the Majesty's Court of King's Bench and Common Pleas at Westminster and also a Solicitor of the High Court of Chancery of the third part the said Duke Willis for the considerations therein mentioned did put place and bind himself Clerk to the said John Allan Powell to serve him in the Profession of an Attorney ~~at Law~~ and Solicitor ~~in Chancery~~ from the day of the date of the said Articles for the term of five years from thence next ensuing and fully to be complete and ended and which said Articles were in due form of law executed by the said William Willis Duke Willis and John Allan Powell on the said eighth day of March Instant in the presence of this Deponent and of Benjamin Brookes of Lincoln Inn said Gentleman and that the Names "Ben. Brookes" and "Wm Chapman" set and subscribed as Witnesses to the due Execution thereof are of the proper handwriting of the said Benjamin Brookes and of this Deponent
