

## William Denyer 1843 Will & Probate

**This is the last Will and Testament**  
of me William Denyer of Liphook in the Parish of Bramshott in the County of Southampton Carpenter hereby in the first place I direct that all my just debts and funeral and testamentary charges and expenses be fully paid and satisfied out of my personal estate by my executors hereinafter named and I give devise and bequeath all and every my freehold copyhold leasehold and other messuages tenements or dwellinghouses farms or lands hereditaments and other real estate whatsoever and wheresoever is and of what nature kind or quality soever the same shall or may consist of and to wit I shall be entitled at the time of my decease and also all and singular my mortgages bills bonds debts ready money and securities for money and all other my Personal Estate and Effects whatsoever and wheresoever and to wit I shall be entitled at the time of my decease subject nevertheless to the payment of my just debts and funeral and testamentary charges and expenses unto William Watts of Basingstoke in the County of Southampton Yeoman and John Watts of Liphook aforesaid Yeoman and the survivor of them and the their executors and administrators of such a survivor upon trust to receive and take the rents issues and profits of all and singular my said real estate and the dividends interest and annual proceeds of my said personal estate and pay and apply the same as and when the same shall be received by them unto my wife Ann Talbot the wife of James Talbot of Portsea in the County of Southampton aforesaid in this my last Will and Testament to and for her own sole and separate use and benefit during the term of her natural life and it is my will and meaning that the same shall not be in any way subject to the debts contract or engagement of her present or any future husband and that the receipt and receipts of my said wife notwithstanding coverture shall be a good and sufficient discharge and discharges to my said trustees for all sums and sums of money which shall be paid to and received by my said wife as such rents issues and profits dividends interest and annual product of my said real and personal estates and from and immediately after the decease of my said wife then I give devise and bequeath all and every my said messuages tenements or dwellinghouses farms lands hereditaments and real estate and also all and singular my mortgages bills notes ready money debts and

services for money and all other my personal estate unto all and every of  
 the children of my said wife Anne Talbot as may be living at the time of  
 her decease lawfully begotten their heirs executors administrators and assigns  
 for ever as tenants in common and share alike and it is my particular will  
 and desire to be buried in Westminster Churchyard and that my grave may  
 be as near as possible to that of my late father Richard Scuyer and to be  
 carried to my grave by my tenants and that each of them do receive a silk  
 band and pair of gloves and two shillings and sixpence for their trouble  
 and I direct that my trustees and executors hereinafter named shall not be  
 answerable or accountable for any loss which may happen to my said trust  
 estate so that the same happen without their wilful neglect or default nor  
 shall one of them be answerable or accountable for the other of them but each  
 of them for himself and his own acts and deeds only and I also direct that my  
 said trustees and executors shall and may repay and reimburse themselves  
 and allow unto each other all just costs charges and expenses as they shall or  
 may reasonably bear pay sustain or be put unto in or about the execution of  
 this my will or the trusts hereby in them imposed and I do hereby nominate  
 constitute and appoint the said William Werts and John Werts joint executors  
 of this my will and revoke all other wills by me at any time heretofore made  
 and declare this only to be and contain my last will and testament in wit-  
 ness whereof I the said William Scuyer have to this my last will and testa-  
 ment set my hand and seal the sixth day of August one thousand eight  
 hundred and thirty four. *Will<sup>m</sup> Denyer S<sup>r</sup>* Signed sealed published and  
 declared by the said William Scuyer the testator as and for his last will and  
 testament in the presence of us *Mr. And Minchin, J. Gresham, Chas. Gresham.*

**Proved** at London 24<sup>th</sup> January 1843 before the Judge by the Oath of William  
 Werts one of the Executors to whom Administration was granted having been  
 first sworn by Commission duly to administer. Power reserved of making the like  
 Oath to John Werts the other Executor when he shall apply for the same.
